

WHEN SHOULD PEOPLE NOT ENTER THE SWIMMING POOL?

CHICKENPOX	Exclude until blisters have dried.
CONJUNCTIVITIS	Exclude until discharge has stopped
DIARRHEA	Exclude until no loose motions for previous 24hrs
HEAD LICE	No exclusion as long as treated when made aware of it
HEPATITIS A	Exclude until med certificate of recovery received and jaundice gone
HEPATITIS B	No exclusion
IMPETIGO (SCHOOL SORES)	Exclude until antibiotics commenced. Waterproof dressing <u>must</u> cover the sores
MEASLES	Exclude for 4 days after onset of rash
MENINGOCOCCAL	Exclude until antibiotic treatment completed
MUMPS	Exclude for 9 days after onset of swelling
RINGWORM/TINEA	Exclude until day after antifungal treatment commenced. Ringworm <u>must</u> be covered with waterproof bandage.
ROTAVIRUS	Exclude until no loose motions for previous 24hrs
RUBELLA	Exclude until fully recovered
SCABIES	Exclude until day after treatment commenced
TUBERCULOSIS (TB)	Exclude until medical certificate of recovery received
WHOOPING COUGH	Exclude until 5 days after starting antibiotics OR for 21 days since onset of cough
